CLOTHING:

- All attire of campers and leaders should be conducive to a Christian atmosphere. This is not a dress up camp. Leave your Sunday dress clothes at home.
- NO short-shorts (Longer shorts are permitted), belly shirts, tube tops, spaghetti straps, or shirts that are revealing, no offensive or suggestive language or graphics are allowed. Decisions about the suitability of clothing items are left to the discretion of the Camp Leaders.
- Shoes must be worn at all times. Aqua shoes ARE permitted in the pool.
- Items to bring include:
 - Light sweater or jacket
 - One-piece swimsuit
 - Dark T-shirt (Girls who wear a two-piece swimsuit MUST wear a dark t-shirt over the swimsuit)
 - Robe or beach towel

Activity: Bring a White tee shirt

- LINENS: Twin size sheets, pillow and case, blanket, sleeping bag, towels and wash cloths for 5 days. Showers are available and their use is encouraged.
- TOILET ARTICLES: Toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, comb, deodorant, etc.
- BOOKS: BRING YOUR BIBLE (put your name in it), notepad, pencil or pens.
- MONEY: Campers are to bring money to purchase snacks. We suggest you not bring more than \$10 per camper. Lost or stolen money is the sole responsibility of the camper.

Camp Rules

- 1. Everything at our Camp belongs to GOD. Treat it as such so glory will be brought to HIM.
- 2. No marring of camp property by writing or carving.
- 3. No fireworks or firearms are permitted in the Campgrounds.
- 4. DO NOT BRING IPODs, MP3s, CELL PHONES, RADIOS, CD PLAYERS, GAMEBOYS, OTHER GAME PLAYERS, OR ANYTHING ELECTRONIC.
- 5. No smoking, illegal drugs, or intoxicating beverages are allowed.
- 6. Campers are **REQUIRED** to attend all classes and worship events, and to **participate** in all camp activities unless excused by the CAMP LEADER for physical or medical reasons.
- 7. Camp discipline will be handled by the SCBA Staff. Campers may be sent home as a last resort as a disciplinary measure.
- 8. ***Campers are not permitted to leave the campgrounds without written permission from the parent /guardian who sent them to camp <u>AND</u> the Camp Director.
- 9. Swimming is permitted only under supervision of the lifeguard and only at set times. Appropriate swimwear must be worn in the pool. No cutoffs are allowed. Girls who wear a two-piece swimsuit **MUST** wear a dark t-shirt over the swimwear. Everyone **MUST** wear their towel for a covering while walking to and from the pool.
- 10. <u>All attire (dress) of campers and leaders should be conducive to a Christian atmosphere.</u> Longer shorts, for boys and girls, may be worn during camp activities (no short-shorts, belly shirts, tube tops, spaghetti straps, etc., no offensive or suggestive language or graphics are allowed). Decisions about the suitability of clothing items are left to the discretion of the Camp Leaders. This is not a dress up camp – leave your Sunday dress clothes at home.
- 11. Every camper is to be in bed at "Lights Out" and is to remain in bed until time to arise.
- 12. Campers are assigned to groups and may not change unless they have permission from the Cabin Leaders. Cabin Leaders must report any change to the Camp Leader.
- 13. Sickness or accidents are to be immediately reported to the Camp Leader and the Camp First Aid Person.
- 14. Cabin Leaders are to conduct cabin devotions with their groups at scheduled times.
- 15. Campers are responsible for keeping buildings and grounds clean at all times.
- 16. Enforcement of rules is the responsibility of all camp leaders under the direction of the Camp Director.
